Fantastic Rainforest Fun in Y3

Year 3 have been learning about and investigating the rainforest. They took their learning outside to collect a range of materials. They replicated



the layers of the rainforest using sticks, grass and mud. Along with this, they made rainforest animals using clay.

Using bits of our environment, they added to the creatures to give them features. The children were encouraged to be creative and blend parts of different animals together.



They created butterflies, caterpillars and even had a hybrid parrot-sloth!





On Tuesday 23rd March, the bug man from 'Bugsnstuff' came to school to show the children a range of creatures that are indigenous to the rainforest. They saw a poison dart frog, giant stick insects and a tarantula. They even got to touch the Boa Constrictor—amazing! The children absolutely loved it and haven't stopped talking about it.

Well done to everyone who helped raise £180.


Congratulations to all of the Easter Egg winners. We gave out about 50 eggy prizes. The staff donated a huge amount so thanks to them. We raised £182 for school.

The History Man brings the Tudors to life



Y5 have been studying a fabulous topic on the Tudors and have welcomed the History Guy to bring it to life. He brought in a whole range of artefacts form the Tudor period and explained how life was.

The children got the opportunity to

dress up and investigate Tudor weapons through enacting the Battle Of Bosworth. They

learnt about Tudor medicine, played games and tried archery!

The Tudors have provided a great topic for the class to develop their research skills in geography. They compared maps from the Tudor period with those from the modern era and discussed reasons for those differences. In fact, the Tudor topic has developed all areas of the curriculum including portrait art work based
