Communicating: Open and read emails. Apply skills from Word processing units to create a template for a letter.

Presentation: Research and create a presentation on PowerPoint. Include simple transitions in a presentation.

Word Processing: Place work into columns in order to write a news report. Add effects to an image to make it fit the piece.

Data handling: Plan and create a database to answer questions. Identify different types of data.

Digital Research: Use more complex search criteria to narrow down my search. Know that not all websites are accurate checking information. Know what plagiarism is and when I can use the work of others.

General Skills: Use keyboard shortcuts when typing, i.e. shift for a capital. Use computer tools such as calculator.

Self-image and identity: To explain how my online identity can be different to the identity I present in 'real life'. Knowing this, I can describe the right decisions about how I interact with others and how others perceive me.

Online Relationships: To describe strategies for safe and fun experiences in a range of online social environments. To give examples of how to be respectful to others online.

Online Reputation: To describe how to find out information about others by searching online. To explain ways that some of the information about anyone online could have been created, copied or shared by others.

Online Bullying: To recognise when someone is upset, hurt or angry online. To describe ways people can be bullied through a range of media (e.g. image, video, text, chat). To explain why people need to think carefully about how content they post might affect others, their feelings and how it may affect how others feel about them (their reputation)

Online safety

Managing online information: To analyse information to make a judgement about probable accuracy and I understand why it is important to make my own decisions regarding content. To describe some of the methods used to encourage people to but things online (e.g. advertising offers, in-app purchases, pop-ups). To explain what is meant by fake news.

Health, well-being and lifestyle: To explain how using technology can distract me from other things I might do or should be doing. To identify times or situations when I might need to limit the amount of time I use technology. To suggest strategies to help me limit this time.

Privacy and Security: To explain what a strong password is .To explain that others online can pretend to be me or other people, including my friends. To explain how the internet can be monitored. To describe strategies for keeping my personal information private, depending on context. To suggest reasons why they might do this

Copyright and Ownership: When searching on the internet for content to use, I can explain why I need to consider who owns it and whether I have the right to reuse it. To give some simple examples of content which I must not use without the permission from the owner, e.g. videos, music, images
